Reducing energy costs in your agricultural business

In the November 2020 budget the Victorian government announced a \$30 million extension to the <u>Agriculture Energy Investment Plan</u>. The AEIP is open to farmers and businesses whose primary operation is in the agriculture sector. The plan supports agricultural businesses to



reduce energy costs, improve energy efficiency and explore other energy options.

<u>Apply for a free on-farm energy assessment</u> to understand where energy efficiency improvements can be made. Undertaking an on-farm energy assessment provides you with advice and a plan to reduce on-farm energy consumption and bills, which may not require any further upfront investments.

Applications for on-farm energy assessments close 15 July 2021.

Indi's Powering Communities Program 2021

Are you a community group looking to reduce energy use, save money and lower emissions? The

Powering Communities Program in Indi provides \$67,700 to fund up to 12 small projects that will assist community groups to improve energy efficiency practices, lower energy use, save money and reduce emissions.

Eligible purchases include solar PV, batteries, air conditioning, hot water heaters, LED lighting, cooktops and refrigerators and energy audits. A full list can be found in the Guidelines <u>here</u>.

To submit an expression of interest please complete this online form. Expressions of interest must be submitted online by **5.00pm Friday 2 July 2021**. Once received, expressions of interest will be assessed by my grants consultative committee in mid-July 2021. Successful applicants will then be invited to make a full application for funding.

Zero Emissions Vehicle Subsidy Program

The Victorian Government has allocated \$46 million to encourage Victorians to buy an ZEV sooner through the <u>Zero Emissions Vehicle Subsidy Program</u>, saving people up to \$3,000 on the purchase of a ZEV and driving Victoria's transition to a net-zero emissions future.

This program is **now open** with 20,000 subsidies available.

Bolstering renewable energy with software trial at Wangaratta Community Energy Hub

In late May <u>Indigo Power</u> launched new soft ware demonstrating how much locally generated renewable energy is being used in the Wangaratta Community Energy Hub. The software allows users to see the percentage of their electricity being generated locally by renewable energy assets including rooftop solar.

Climate Change will cost a young Australian up to \$245k over their lifetime

The Federal Court has dismissed a bid by a group of Australian teenagers seeking to prevent Federal Environment Minister Sussan Ley from approving a coalmine extension in New South Wales. While the teens' request for an injunction was unsuccessful, new figures on the financial costs of climate change to young Australians over their lifetimes emerged during the court proceedings.

An independent expert witness put the loss at between A\$125,000 and A\$245,000 per person. The calculation did not include health impacts which were assessed separately. To read the full article click here.
