Biscuit packets (outer wrapper only)	<i>Plastic bottles</i>
Bread bags (without the tie)	<i>Plastic containers</i>
Bubble wrap (large sheets cut into A3 size pieces)	<b><i>Rigid plastic e.g. meat trays, biscuit trays or strawberry punnets</i></b>
Cat and dog food pouches (clean and dry)	<i>Adhesive tape</i>
Cellophane from bunches of flowers (cut into A3 size pieces)	<i>Balloons ( any)</i>
Cereal box liners	<i>Biodegradable/degradable/compostable plastics</i>
Chip and cracker packets (silver lined)	<i>Blister packs, tablets &amp; capsule packaging</i>
Chocolate and snack bar wrappers	<i>Blow up pools &amp; pool toys - plastic or PVC</i>
Cling Wrap - free of food residue	<i>Bread bag tags</i>
Confectionery bags	<i>Christmas tinsel &amp; Christmas trees</i>
Dry pet food bags	<b><i>Coffee bags</i></b>
Fresh produce bags	<i>Cooler bags</i>
Frozen food bags	<i>Disposable food handling gloves of any variety</i>
Green bags (Polypropylene Bags)	<i>Drinking straws</i>
Ice cream wrappers	<i>Film negatives &amp; x-rays</i>
Large sheets of plastic that furniture comes wrapped in (cut into A3 size pieces)	<i>Foam or polystyrene of any kind</i>
Netting produce bags ( metal clips removed)	<i>Foil / Alfoil of any kind</i>
Newspaper and magazine wrap	<i>Food waste</i>
Pasta bags	<i>Glass</i>
Plastic Australia Post satchels	<i>Laminated materials &amp; overhead transparencies</i>
Plastic carrier bags from all stores	<i>Medical waste materials</i>
Plastic film wrap from grocery items such as nappies and toilet paper	<i>Paper &amp; cardboard</i>
Plastic sachets	<i>Paper post packs</i>
Potting mix & compost bags - both plastic & woven polypropylene types (cut into A3 size pieces, free of as much product as possible)	<i>Plastic/clear vinyl packaging from sheets and doonas etc</i>
Rice bags - both plastic & woven type (if large, cut into A3 size pieces)	<i>Plastic packaging that has contained meat</i>
Snap lock bags / zip lock bags	<i>Plastic strapping used for securing boxes &amp; pallets</i>
Squeeze pouches with lid on (e.g. yogurt/baby food)	<i>Powdered milk packets, made of foil</i>
Wine bladders - clear plastic ones only	<i>Rubber, rubber gloves, latex</i>
	<i>Tarpaulins</i>
	<i>Tin cans</i>
	<i>Wet plastic as mould is a problem</i>
	<i>Wine bladders - foil based</i>
	<i>Wrapping paper &amp; cardboard, ribbons or bows</i>
