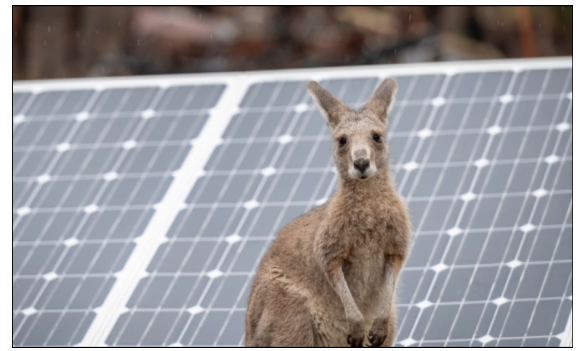

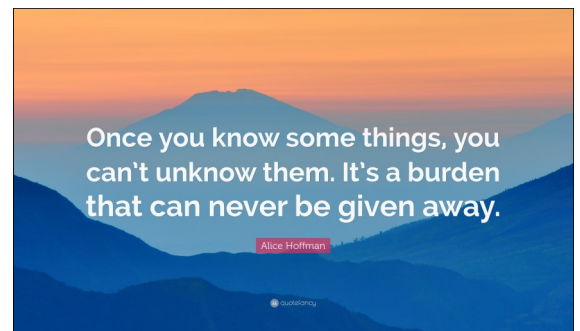

Associate Professor Michael-Shawn Fletcher

Michael is Wiradjuri man, Physical Geography researcher and Assistant Dean (Indigenous), Faculty of Science at University of Melbourne. He is also Director of Research Capability at the Indigenous Knowledge Institute.

Michael is interested in the long-term interactions between humans, climate, disturbance and vegetation at local, regional and global scales. He says, "My current work involves developing records of landscape change over the past few centuries to understand the impacts and legacies of the waves of European invasions and subsequent colonisations across the global south".



Dr Kerryn Higgs

Kerryn received her Ph.D. in Geography and Environmental Studies from the University of Tasmania, where she is now a University Associate. She is an Associate Member of the International Centre of the Club of Rome and is author of the book 'Collision Course - Endless Growth on a Finite Planet'.

Kerryn recently featured in the film 'Brazen Hussies' (2020), screened at Swanpool Cinema and later on the ABC. Kerryn spoke at SEFF 2016 and we welcome her back to Swanpool for a 2021 update on Limits to Growth. Are the forecasts coming to fruition?
